We currently have three dedicated seventeen-year-old young men who are training and responding with our volunteer firefighters. These young men have responded to a variety of calls including traffic accidents, structure fires, wildland fires, and medical calls. They are currently working on finishing up the requirements to earn their Firefighter 1 structure fire certification. This certification requires many hours of classroom lessons (outside of regular school and work hours), study time at home, and a live burn exercise.
